John Matthew Crowell was born in Jefferson county, Va., 18 June 1823, died in the Hawaiian Islands in 1881, and was buried there. His father, Samuel Crowell, was born in Cumberland county, Penna., 7 May 1793, and died in Fremont, Ohio, 9 April 1859. His mother, Mary Link, the daughter of Adam Link, Jr., was born in Jefferson county, Va., 11 Dec. 1792, and died in Fremont 16 March 1856. They were married in Jefferson county 16 June 1814.

John Matthew Crowell married in Fremont, Chio, 30 April 1848, Ann Thraves. She was born in Nottingham, England, in 1826, died in Yuba county, Calif., 3 July 1866, and was buried in Camptonville, Calif.

Abner Buell Crowell came to California with his parents via the Isthmus of Panama in 1855, sailing from New York. They settled in Yuba county, first in Fosters Bar and later in Camptonville, and engaged in Placer mining. He worked in and about the mines until after his mother's death, when he returned to the east, clarked in his Uncle George's store in Peru, Ind., and attended school. When he was about 19 years old, he returned to California, coming everland by train, and taught school in Grangeville, then part of Tulare county but now in Kings county, boarding at the home of Capt. Peter Kanamyer, whose daughter he married. In about 1873 he purchased 160 acres of government land and began farming on the tract that is now known as the Growell sub-division and is adjacent to Hanford. He and his wife lived on this farm until 1908, engaging principally in dairying. In 1908 his health failed and he retired and they moved to Cakland. They lived there until Mrs. Crowell's death, when he went to his daughter's home in Monterey.

He was raised to a Master Mason in Hanford Lodge No. 279, F. & A.M., 13 Sept. 1890. He was a trustee of the Hanford High School from the time the district was formed until 1908, and was for many years a trustee of the Hanford Grammar School.

Mary Ann Kanawyer came to California when she was six years old, with her father, who was in charge of an extrain. She was a member of Lucerne Chapter O.E.S. at Hanford and an active member of the Christian church.

Abner Buel Growell and his wife celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in Oakland in 192h, at which all of their living children and grandchildren were present. They both attended the Pioneer Day Celebration in Hanford in 1927, and were given special honors as among the oldest pioneers of Hanford.

Notes on the Crowell family, supposed to be lineal descendants of Oliver Crowwell, Lord Protector of Englands

Samuel Crowell, a soldier in the Revolutionary War, was born in New Jersey in October 1761 and died in Essex county, N.J., in 1782. He married Thankful Earl, who was born in September 1760. Children:

Samuel Crowell, the son of Samuel and Thankful (Earl) Crowell, was born in Essent county, N.J., 26 Sept. 1766, and baptized in December 1771. He died 30 Nov. 1834, and was buried in Newville, Cumber-land Co., Penna. He married first 25 March 1789, Mary Walker, the daughter of Joseph and Rachel (Johnson) Walker, natives of Ireland. She was born in Cumberland county 5 July 1769, and died in Jefferson county, Va., 7 July 1793. Samuel Crowell married secondly 18 May 1795, Polly Walker, a cousin of his first wife.

Samuel Crowell, the son of Samuel and Mary (Walker) Crowell, married Mary Link. They were the parents of the pioneer.

Adam Link, Jr., the father of Mary Link, was born in Philadelphia, Penna., 31 Dec. 1756. He married in Frederickstown, Md., Jane Ogle, born near there 23 Sept. 1761, the daughter of Alexander and Martha (Patty)Ogle. His father was Adam Link, born in Germany 21 Aug. 1722. His mother was Klizabeth Miller.

The above items were taken from records made in an old Bible in 1816 by Samuel Crowell, 3rd. This Bible was presented to him by his father-in-law, Adam Link. The following notes are on a separate sheet of paper, and while it appears that Samuel Crowell, Revolutionary soldier (above), was the son of Samuel and —— (Ward) Crowell, no statement to that effect is made on the original paper. Elizabeth C. Kolb, who signed the paper, states: "The line has been proven to a Revolutionary ancestor and I am confident that it can be traced back further. I have considerable information concerning it."

Samuel Crowell, the founder of the Crowell family of South Crange, N.J., was born in or near Woodbridge, Middlesex Co., N.J., 11 July 1711, and was the son of Edward and Sarah (Vail) Crowell. He probably came to South Grange when quite young, as his name is mentioned in the opening of the road, now called Parker Averme, in 1728. Samuel Growell was married three times. The names of the first two wives are unknown. The third wife was —— Ward. By his first wife he had one son, Joseph; by his second wife, three children, Daniel, Recompense and Samuel; and by his third wife, Aaron, Phebe and Sarah. Ref.: Ms, unsigned, entitled "The Crowell Family of South Grange Township, New Jersey" in the possession of the New Jersey Society, 16 West Park Street, Newark.

Samuel Crowell, son of Edward Crowell of Woodbridge, N.J., born 1711, had four sons and two grandsons in the Revolutionary War. Ref.: Gencalogical Notes of the Newark Evening News, now in scrap book No. 4, in the library of the New Jersey Historical Society, Newark. No. 4540.

Samuel Crowell was born in 1711 and died in 1764, as letters of administration were granted 31 May 1764. Ref.: N. J. Wills, Liber H. p. 377. Trenton, N.J.

Letters of administration were granted D: Nov. 1735, to Samuel Crowell's widow, Thankful Crowell, his brother Daniel, and Joseph Tompkins. Ref.: N.J. Wills, Trenton. Liber 27, p. 377

Edward Crow, b. about 1644, came to Woodbridge, N.J., from Massachusetts, and died leaving a widow and five children. The widow, Mary (Lathrop) Crow m. (2) before 1695. Her first husband died in 1688. Children by the first marriage were Mary, ——, Yelverton, Benjamin, and Edward, b. in 1685.

Edward Crowell, the son of Edward and Mary (Lathrop) Crow, was born in Woodbridge in 1685 and was the first of the family to determine the modern spelling of the name as Crowell. Among his children were Elizabeth, b. in 1708, and Samuel, b. in 1711.

Samuel, the son of Edward Crowell, was born in Woodbridge in 1711, and married —— Ward, the sister of Abel and Elihu Ward. About 1728 he bought and settled upon land in what is now South Grange, N.J. His children were Joseph, Daniel, Samuel and Aaron. His four sons and two grandsons were soldiers in the Revolutionary War. Ref.: New Jersey Genealogy, 2:726.
